

**The National Honor Society** has been in existence since 1921. From the beginning, the objectives have been to create an enthusiasm for scholarship, to stimulate a desire to render service, to promote worthy leadership, and to encourage the development of character in the nation's secondary school students. The National Honor Society is considered a prestigious organization, ranking high among administrators, faculty members, students, parents, and residents of the school community. Membership in The National Honor Society is both an honor and a responsibility. Students selected for membership are expected to continue to demonstrate the qualities of scholarship, service, leadership, and character.

**The selection procedure** for National Honor Society Members is as follows:

- Students' academic records are reviewed to determine scholastic eligibility
- Students are notified that they are eligible scholastically. Students are asked to complete a Student Activity Information Form for further consideration.
- The Student Activity Information Form is reviewed by The National Honor Society Faculty Council. Other verifiable information may be used to determine the candidate's qualities in leadership, service, and character.
- Candidates receiving a majority vote from the Faculty Council will be inducted.
- Students who are selected, and their parents, will be notified of their selection and will be given information regarding the induction ceremony and the obligations of membership in The National Honor Society.
