
Each year, we rely on generous donors from our community to support the people and programs that cultivate excellence and a thriving Christian community at LCS.

Faith Integration is a core pillar of the curriculum that sets LCS apart as a Christian school. The school has an unwavering commitment to understanding the Bible as the infallible, authoritative Word of God. LCS students engage in Bible class from preschool through twelfth grade, but it doesn't stop there. Teachers connect content across grades and subjects to the grand biblical narrative of Creation, Fall, Redemption, and Restoration. Then, they give opportunities for students to live out that story by using their learning to meet real needs in our school and the greater community.

Educating Students to the Full Extent of their GodGiven Gifts and Abilities

LCS is committed to providing differentiated learning to meet the needs of learners, including both support and enrichment. This level of individualized instruction depends on students being known by their teachers, who understand students' interests, challenges, and strengths.

Individualized Learning

Instructional practices like small-group instruction in reading and math allow teachers to provide targeted learning opportunities. Advanced Placement courses are part of a rigorous academic program that prepare students for college-level academics. The Educational Support Services program provides extra support for student learning needs.









Extra-Curricular Opportunities

Students can participate in various extracurricular and co-curricular opportunities for academic challenge and opportunities to grow in knowledge, leadership, and service. Middle and high school students may take part in Math Club, Multicultural Club, Student Council, the National Honor Society, and more. Elementary students have opportunities to participate in Mileage Club, the PreK-12 Student Ambassador Program, and serve in the School Safety Program.

Creative Arts

A flourishing creative arts program is an important part of Christ-centered education at LCS. Each school year is filled with creative arts programs and performances that demonstrate how students are reflecting God as our Creator through music and the visual and performing arts.

Athletic Program

LCS provides a PreK-12 athletic program where students grow in education, faith, competition, and teamwork. The goal is for LCS teams to be a light for Christ in Greater Lansing and to cultivate skill development and positive athletic experiences beginning in the elementary grades and continuing on through high school.





Parents in the Classroom

LCS parents offer time and presence to support teachers and students in classroom learning. Parents accompany classes on field trips, chaperone retreats and other trips, volunteer in classrooms, participate as guest readers, share about their careers, and are involved in countless other ways throughout the year.



Parents in Educational Partnership

Parents participate in Parent EDU sessions to learn from a lead educator and one another while engaging in topics that are relevant and applicable to educating their children. LCS Parent EDU sessions inform, equip, and encourage parents to support excellence in their child's education at home.



Parents in the Community

LCS parents participate as leaders and volunteers in community events and school celebrations throughout the year. Parents play a key leadership role in annual events such as Black and Gold, the Elementary Fund Run, Field Day, and Spring Fling.









Engaging Students in an Academically Challenging Environment

LCS emphasizes holistic, formational learning directed by the LCS vision. Intellectual growth is fostered through an academic program that is focused on proficiency in foundational knowledge in each subject. All LCS students have opportunities to grow in Habits of Learning, such as curiosity, persistence, and effective communication.

LCS believes that students learn best in the context of healthy Christ-centered relationships among students and staff who provide intentional structures of individualized support. Advising and homeroom provide structured times for purposeful exploration of and growth in God's calling for middle and high school students. LCS aims for each student to graduate with an increased confidence in the story God is weaving in and through their life and an ongoing curiosity about the ways God is inviting them to engage and transform His world.

Equipping Students to Exalt God and Follow Christ in All of Life

A powerful way to equip students to exalt God and follow Christ is for teachers to model it. LCS teachers serve as Christ-like models for students, providing exceptional instruction and living out their faith with students. LCS teachers also prioritize excellence in their work through sustained collaboration to support student learning and professional growth. All teachers participate in teams to focus on advancing school improvement goals.

Students are also equipped by living and learning in Christian community, which helps set the foundation for following Christ in all of life. Spiritual growth is fostered through worship opportunities at twice-weekly chapels, Bible classes, and the fall retreat for middle and high school students - a hallmark of the LCS experience.





Alumni Profile — Abigail Ginn

Abigail (Helmker) Ginn first knew she wanted to serve in full-time missions in high school. Abigail began her time at LCS as a freshman, where she participated in basketball, softball, bowling, and the National Honor Society. Abigail values the commitment to service that was integral throughout her time at LCS. Some of her fondest memories are of Service Week, where she had the opportunity to serve the people of Lansing through various projects. "These were such valuable moments to be Christ's hands and feet and to engage with community members who I might not have otherwise met," she says.


Abigail's husband, Brian, not only supports her calling, but is also a physician who feels called to medical missions. "I am incredibly thankful that after 13+ years of preparation, we will be moving with our son to Papua New Guinea in January of 2024 to serve as missionary doctors at Kudjip Nazarene Hospital," Abigail says. "We will be serving in Papua New Guinea for at least two years through Samaritan's Purse and we are hopeful to continue serving as long as God calls us to stay."

Looking back on her high school years, Abigail shares that LCS was foundational, both academically and spiritually. "In many ways, my academic experience at LCS laid a strong foundation for my college career and beyond. I am thankful for the breadth of subjects I was exposed to and frequently find myself applying the information I learned there. The study methods I learned at LCS have helped me to be successful in college and medical school."

Abigail's teachers were also significant in her time at LCS. "Having Christian teachers who incorporated Scripture and Biblical principles into each subject helped shape how I understand and apply my faith," she explains. She recalls how her Bible teacher challenged her to understand what she believed and why she believed it. "He taught me to think critically about Scripture and evaluate Biblical teachings within the context they were written in." Her English and writing teacher also helped shape her faith. "He incorporated Christian principles into his lessons and taught me to value different perspectives. These teachers were genuine, approachable, and valued me as a student."

When asked if she has any advice for current students, Abigail says, "Be curious and seize opportunities to learn about and from people who are different from you. Your life will be so much richer and your worldview will be so much broader if you step outside what you know to engage with new people. And you will learn a valuable lesson by viewing a particular belief or topic from a different perspective."


